Healthy Snacks

It has been another busy week for our **Nursery** pupils, packed full of fun activities. They have been exploring the jungle and creating their own lion manes, brightly coloured Polly parrots and play dough jungle animals. We have some super scientists who have had great fun completing the science experiment "Jumping Jungle Frog" as well as finding out why elephants have big ears. We have star bakers in our nursery who have made mouth-watering elephant biscuits. They have enjoyed getting physical with "Stezzi the Parrot Yogo" and had fun singing "The Jungle Boogie" song

The theme for our **Reception** pupils' work this week has been "Pirates." They have had fun finding out their own pirate names and making their own pirate hats. Their creative challenge was to construct a pirate telescope to impress Captain Black Beard! Numeracy work has involved practising their counting skills and creating their own bar graphs. They have enjoyed making very healthy cheese and apple pirate ships and keeping fit with "Pirate Just Dance."

Our **Year 1** children have enjoyed listening to "Commotion in the Ocean" with Mrs Hill. They have written rhyming poems and enjoyed researching information and finding fascinating facts about their chosen sea creatures. They have invented their very own sea creatures and labelled their special features, as well as making their own salt dough star fish. Numeracy challenges have involved estimating and measuring as well as keeping skills sharp using our Abacus and Mathletics games.

Year 2 pupils have been very busy using their measuring skills, to weigh out the ingredients needed to make their own pizzas. They have written a set of clear instructions for the recipes and remembered to use time connectives at the start of each instruction. We have seen some very tasty looking pizzas which have also been used to help their understanding of fractions of numbers. They have looked at the similarities between the Italian and Welsh flag and labelled the colours in both Welsh and Italian.

Our **Year 3** pupils have been impressing us with their coding skills and have made very entertaining Flappy Bird games. They have revised features of instructional writing and written their own recipes as well as baking their very own mouth-watering Victoria sponges. We have very talented bakers in Year 3. Numeracy challenges have included multiplying by 10 and 100 and solving word problems. They have read a new Welsh book "Dathlu Dydd Gwyl Dewi" with the help of Mrs Jones.

Year 4 children have researched information about Elizabeth 1 and presented their work in a variety of ways including PowerPoints, mind maps and fact files. Their numeracy work has involved using and reading grids to locate specific objects and creating co-ordinate pictures. Science work has included investigating the importance of a healthy and balanced diet. Year 4 continue to showcase their artistic talents with their impressive drawings of animals from the Galapagos Islands.

Our **Year 5** pupils have been looking at facts and information about a country of their choice. They have completed maps, investigated historical events, completed art work and looked at the main religions of their chosen countries. Their comical nonsense poems have made everyone laugh e.g. "The doughnut, the peanut and the baboon Went sailing off in a cardboard balloon!"

They have also created interesting presentations of their lockdown stories which they have enjoyed sharing with each other. Da iawn Blwyddyn Pump.















Year 6 children have been looking at the picture book "Eric" by Shaun Tan and looked in detail at the different characters, explored the meaning of more difficult vocabulary and expressed their own thoughts and feelings based on the text. They have completed transition activities from Bassaleg School, looking at similarities and differences between primary and secondary schools, the importance of friendship, organisation of timetables and finding their way around the building. They have all been showcasing their artistic talents by designing endpapers representing their journey through school.





