To use place value and the four rules of number to solve problems and complete reasoning tasks.

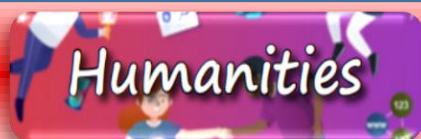
To complete a variety of budgeting tasks, including food rationing in WW2.
