Speculation about return to school.



The Prime Minister made an announcement at the beginning of the week regarding plans for children to return to school in **England**, starting with Reception, Years 1 and 6. Decisions regarding education are devolved to Wales. At the time of writing I am unaware of any decisions or plans here in Wales. The Education Minister in Wales, Kirsty Williams has given assurances that schools in Wales will not return until scientific evidence says it is safe to do so. There is a lot of speculation in the media at present. Please be reassured that as soon as I receive any information I will inform you of it and will explain clearly what that will mean for us here at Pentrepoeth.

We are very aware that many of you are nearly finishing the home learning exercise books that we sent home before school closed. Admission to Reception September 2020

I will be writing to parents/ carers of **NEW** Reception children due to start with us in September on Monday. This will give parents as much information as possible about procedures for admission, including signposting parents and carers to a new Reception Welcome page where there will be welcome video clips from myself and staff. We will be collecting pupil information, consent forms and medical data via e mail. A copy of the School Prospectus will also be available on this page. Details regarding purchasing uniform will also be available in a few weeks.

Admission to Nursery September 2020



I will also be writing to parents/carers of **NEW** Nursery children due to start with us in September 2020. We will be asking you to fill in some paperwork regarding pupil information/ consent forms and medical data. Again, in that letter I will outline procedures for admission, including signposting parents and carers to a new Nursery Welcome page that will have some welcome video clips and a copy of our Nursery Prospectus. Details regarding purchasing uniform will also be available in a few weeks.

Please note that during this unprecedented period we are still unaware of when schools may reopen. This may have an impact on Nursery and Reception admissions. I will keep you up to date with information as I receive it.

It has been another busy week for our pupils from Nursery up to Year 6.

Lots of our children are continuing to develop new skills at home, including gardening, baking, sewing and even wallpapering!

Our **Nursery** pupils have been using their senses to record what they see, smell and hear in their gardens or on their daily walks. They have enjoyed making repeating patterns using natural objects and have even made their own "Petal Perfumes." They have had fun creating and trying to fly their own kites as well as keeping fit and healthy with Coco the Butterfly.

Reception children are continuing to practise their sounds and keeping their number skills sharp by playing fun maths games. They have enjoyed listening to Mrs Webb reading "Rumble in the Jungle" and learning Welsh with Mrs S Jenkins and her two Welsh teddies, lanto and Coch Ci. They have listened to the story "Giraffes Can't Dance" and even made their own giraffes.

Our **Year 1** pupils have enjoyed listening to one of our favourite stories "The Gruffalo" with Mrs Hill. They have been re-telling the story as well as researching interesting information about their favourite pets. Mr Woodham has been helping pupils to talk about the weather in Welsh.

Year 2 children have enjoyed the story "Ping Won't Share" and have practised their reading in Welsh using "Byw yn China" They have been researching information about giant pandas and have produced very impressive PowerPoints. They have been investigating capacity in maths and enjoyed predicting how much water each of their chosen containers held.

Our **Year 3** children are continuing to keep their number skills sharp by using our Abacus and Mathletics games, as well as investigating equivalent fractions. They have been looking at similes, completed Factual Writing Reports based on plastic pollution as well as completing a bird watching project.

Pupils in **Year 4** have been writing non-chronological reports using information collected about Komodo Dragons. They have been developing their data handling skills, by interpreting pictograms and bar charts. Their creative challenge was to create a 3D model of a dragon.

Year 5 pupils have been looking at features of persuasive writing and trying to entice people to visit a country of their choice. They have collected lots of interesting information about their chosen country, as well as practising their Welsh conversations using their Welsh place mats.

Our **Year 6** pupils have enjoyed researching the Victorians and looking at the development of railways and how this impacted on leisure activities for Victorian people. Our Year 6 letters, inspirational messages and artwork have been delivered to the residents in one of our local care homes. Da iawn Blwyddyn 6, we are very proud of your efforts.






























The Time We Spring-Cleaned the World by Laura Gribbons
