This Week's Information

Dear Parent and Carer,

Please find some information for week beginning **26th June 2023**.

ECO Green day – Will take place on Wednesday 5th July. Children may wear green to school and there will be a number of stalls available.

Administration Of Medicine – We do not routinely administer prescribed or non prescribed medication unless as part of a medical plan. Parents or Carers are very welcome to attend school during the day to administer via contacting the school office. Children **MUST NOT** bring any kind of medication in to school.

Move Up Afternoon – Will take place on Thursday 6th July. Children will have the opportunity to work with and meet their new teachers. (Y1-Y6 classes in September – Reception and Nursery classes for Sept have been notified of stay and play dates).

School Uniform – As stated previously our uniform code is stated in the school prospectus. We aim for the uniform to be as affordable, functional and easy as possible. Our school colour is red. Uniform with the school logo is available via Beam in Newport – however, in line with WG new guidance, we have never insisted on logo uniform. Beam's current flyer is available in this newsletter.

PE Uniform – For September will be a **plain red T shirt only** (logo T shirts are available but again not required), **black shorts** and **black trainers**. For winter - **black joggers** and **red school hoodie, fleece or jumper**. No football or sports strips will be allowed for daily PE..

Breakfast Club For September 2023

Important Changes to Breakfast Club for Pupils in Reception to Year 6 from September 2023

We were informed by Newport City Council that the supervision for breakfast club was reduced from 1.9.18. Please see below statement from NCC. Newport City Council fully supports free breakfasts for primary school pupils. The number of breakfast clubs across the city has risen from 7 to 38 over the last 5 years, but supportive funding from Welsh Government has remained the same.

To ensure as many clubs can operate as possible, the council is introducing a new funding model which will see fair and equal distribution of the available money.

'From September 2018, breakfast clubs will be granted funding for up to 40 minutes' worth of supervisory costs. Although this may in some instances be less than currently received, it continues to demonstrate Newport City Council's commitment by continuing to support the operation of clubs above and beyond the 30 minutes recommend recommended by Welsh Government'.

The staff and governors at Pentrepoeth appreciate that the needs of parents here are not normally to provide their child with a free breakfast but to provide early supervision for them to drop their child at school in order for them to go to work earlier than the start of the school day.

Since the pandemic we changed the start time of breakfast club from 8.00am to 8.10am. However, this is not financially sustainable and in order to maintain staffing we will need to revert to post pandemic procedures.

1. Late Bird Breakfast Club

Free breakfast club and free supervision will be referred to as 'Late Bird' breakfast club and will operate from 8.20am – 9.00am. Last entry is at 8.30am. There will continue to be no admittance after this time as time is required to register and feed pupils before the school day.

2. Early Bird Breakfast Club

Early Bird places have to pay for an additional 20 minutes' supervision from 8am – 8.20am. We ask that parents sign up for the days they require but they then are obliged to pay for these days for the term (even if their child does not attend through illness etc. – this will ensure we can afford staffing levels). We ask that payments are made half termly in advance. For Autumn (05/0/23 – 21/12/23) e.g 5 days for the term = £73.00 (2 training days taken out).

Both Early Bird and Late Bird breakfast clubs continue to enter via the main entrance.

If you would like to take the Early Bird paid option then this will be available to book for the term from July 1st via Parent Pay. Payment must be made in advance. Further information regarding payment and information will be sent in a text message in the next few weeks.

Please note ad hoc days for Early Bird will continue to be offered subject to availability through the school office.

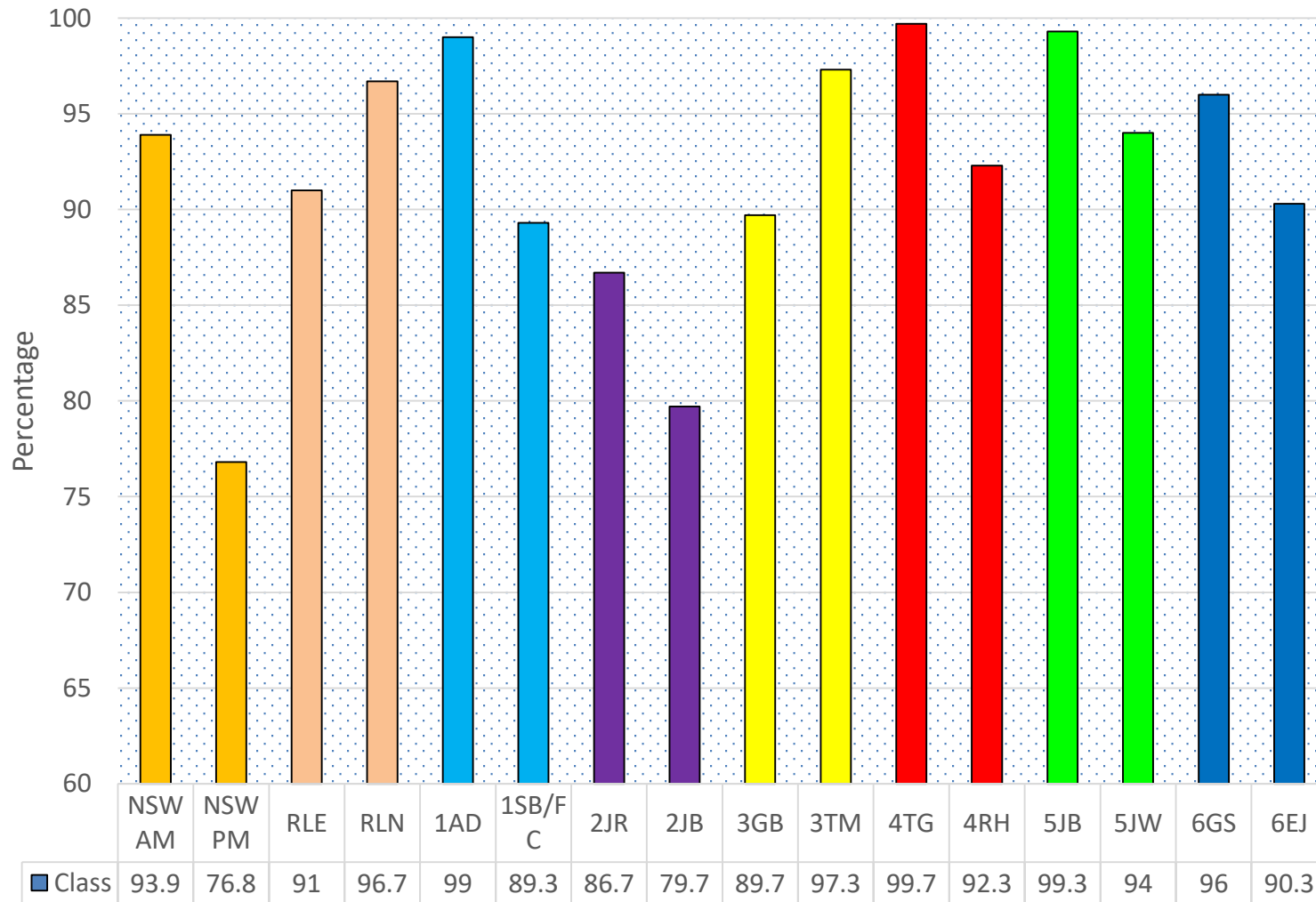
